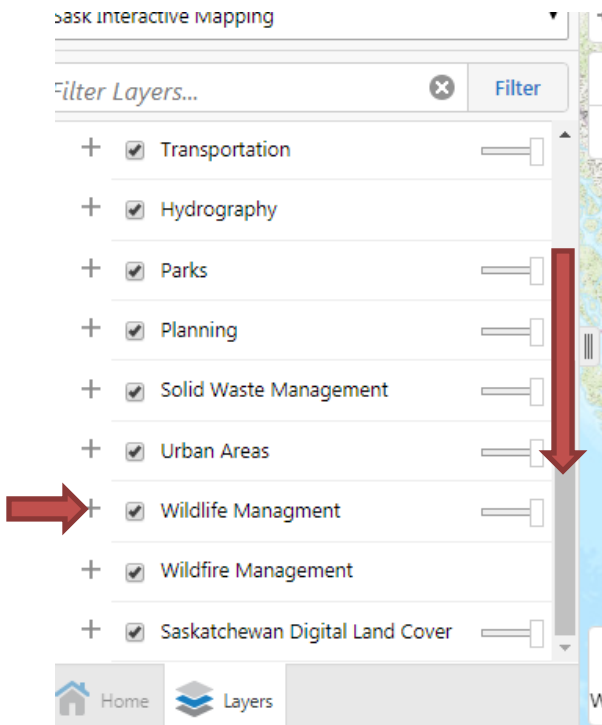


## Step 1: Adding Layers

Once the page loads, you need to add which layers you want to see. Layers are anything from roads, to RM boundaries, to Registered Blocks.

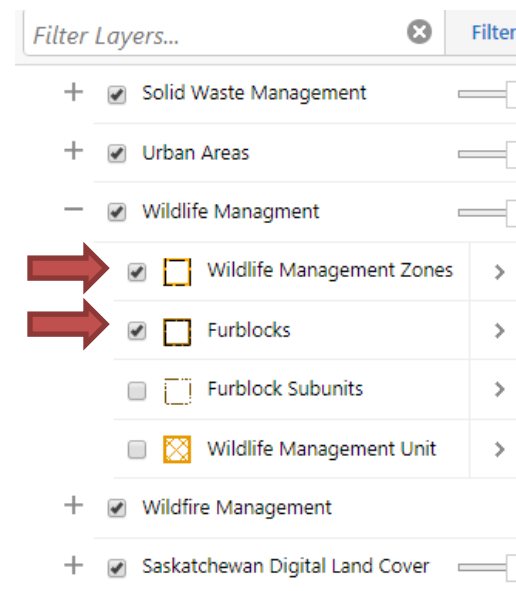

## Step 2: Locating Which Layers You Want



To locate the Registered Blocks and Wildlife Management Zones, they are found under the “Wildlife Management” tab. Scroll downward and click on the “+” to expand the tab.

You can now select the FurBlocks and/or WMZ



If at any time you don't want to see the boundaries, simply uncheck the boxes and they will be removed from your map.

- Rural Municipality boundaries are found under “Administrative”
- Roads are found under “Transportation”
- Provincial Forest is under “Forestry”
- Fish and Wildlife Development Fund lands are under “Planning”
